School Introduces Expanded Sports Programme to Strengthen Participation and Talent Development

The school has introduced a strengthened sports programme to ensure every learner participates meaningfully in physical activity as part of holistic development.

Each learner is expected to take part in a minimum of two sporting disciplines, supporting balance between academics, fitness, discipline, and character building, while helping to identify talent early.

All sports will run fixtures this term, with full participation expected across all age groups to build experience, teamwork, and school spirit.

A key feature is the introduction of Chess as a core discipline from ECD to senior levels, valued for developing critical thinking, focus, and problem-solving skills. Learners are encouraged to have personal chess mats or roll-up boards to support regular practice at school and at home.

Traditional sports such as football and hockey remain central, with parents encouraged to ensure learners have appropriate sporting kit for training and fixtures.

The programme reflects the school's commitment to inclusive participation, talent development, and shaping confident, well-rounded learners.

Second Term Educational Trips - Reminder

As a reminder, the school will be conducting a series of educational trips during the second term as part of our learning programme beyond the classroom.

Destinations include Birds @ 30, 365 Amusement Park, Wild is Life, Victoria Falls, Lion and Cheetah Park, Kuimbashiri, Makumbiri, Kariba, Vumba, Masvingo, and Bulawayo.

These visits are carefully selected to support classroom learning by giving learners real-life exposure to wildlife, geography, history, science, and culture. They promote curiosity, confidence, independence, and a deeper understanding of key concepts taught in class.
