While March may still seem some distance away, preparation starts now. Every lesson, assessment, piece of homework and revision session between now and the examinations will contribute to the learner's readiness.

We therefore encourage parents to stay involved, monitor their child's work and keep in close contact with the class teacher. Early support makes a difference.
